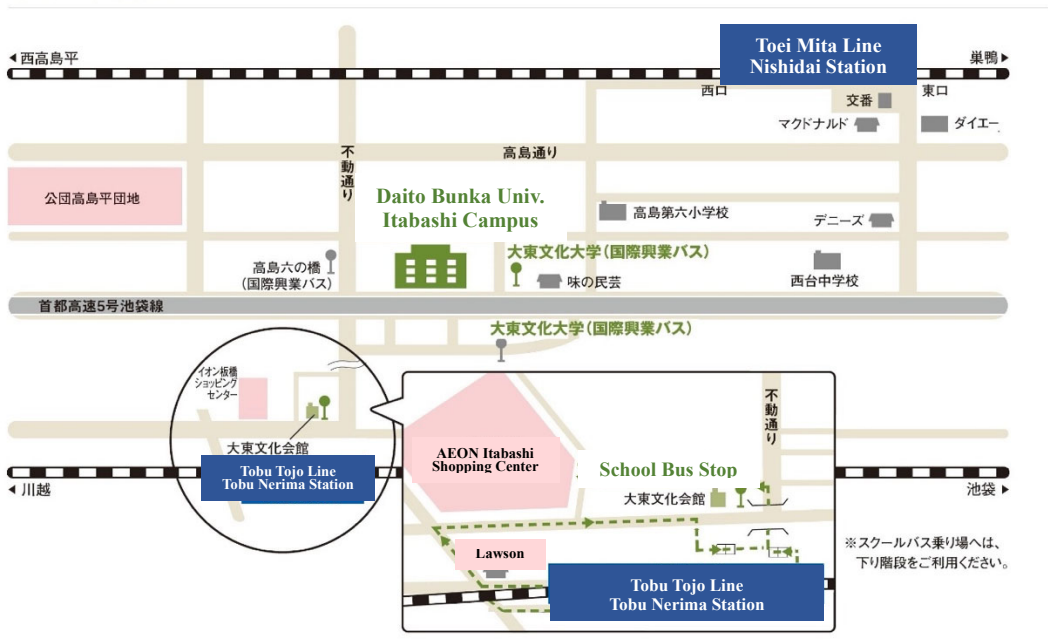

Train → Bus Information

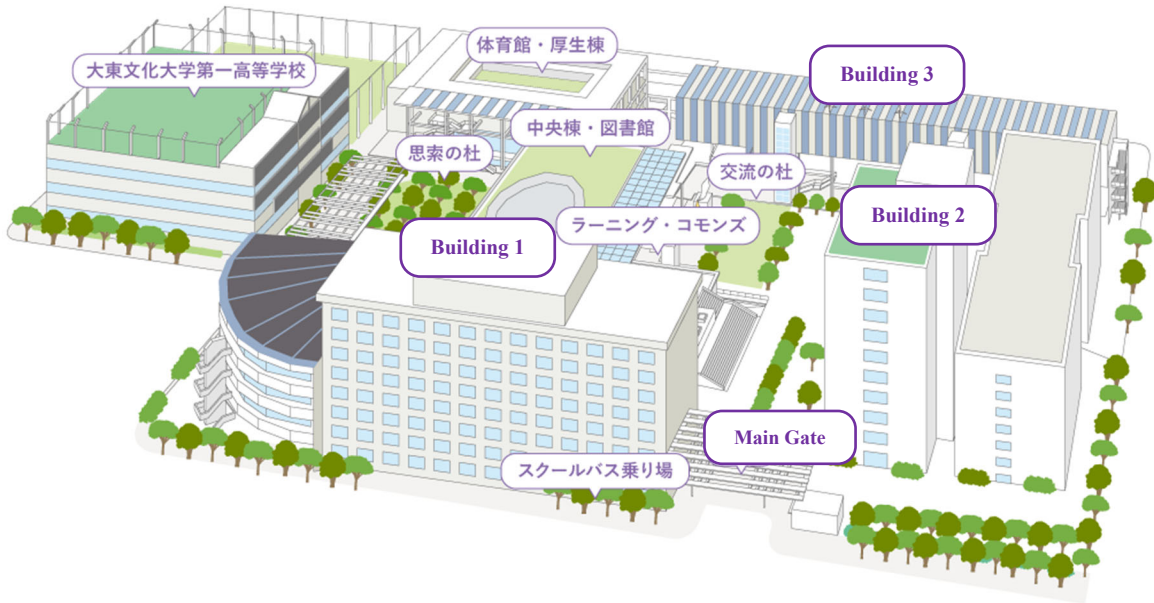
- From Tobu Nerima Station (Daito Bunka University), North Exit

Map around Itabashi Campus

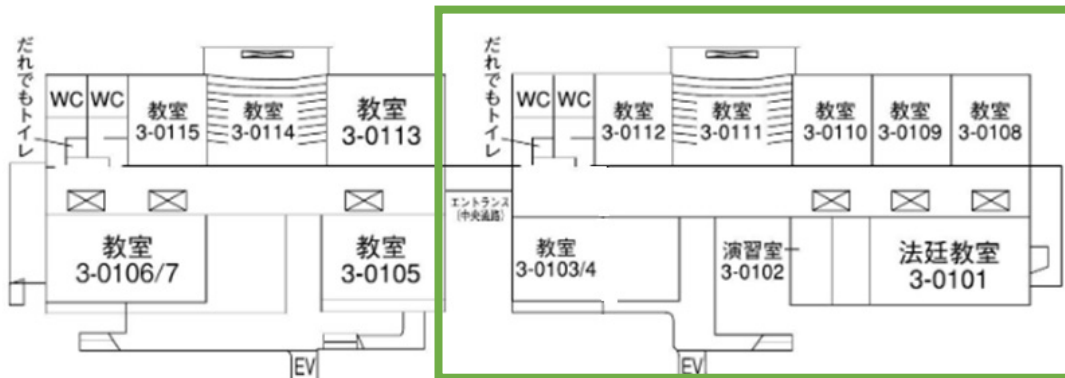


◇ **Campus Map**
